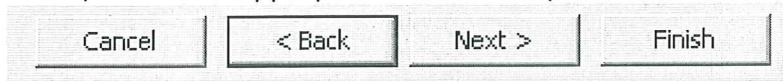

1. When/where is it appropriate to use a sequential menu?

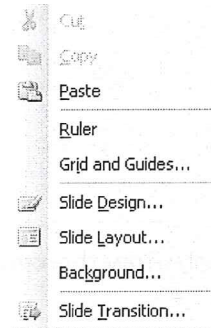

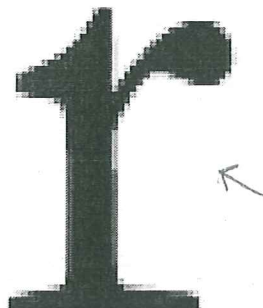
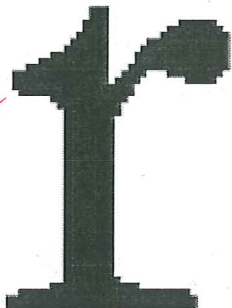
